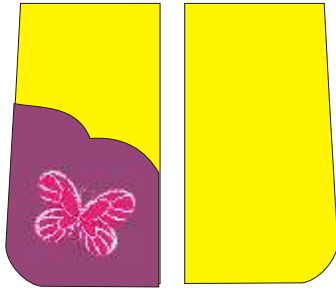


Butterfly purse



Pockets

Hoop your stabilizer, I use 3oz cut away.
Run the placement stitches then lay down your top fabric, run the tack down stitches.
Now run the placement stitches for the lady bug, Lay down the butterfly fabric and run the tack down stitches trim the excess fabric from the butterfly finish running the butterfly.
Now lay down the back fabric and tack it down
Trim the excess fabric both front and back and then finish the design with the satin stitches (Make sure you mirror one of the pockets)
You need 2 pockets. Remove from hoop and carefully trim away excess stabilizer.

Panels

Hoop your stabilizer, I use 3oz cut away
Run the placement stitches, Then lay down your front and back fabric and the pocket (just on 2 of the panels)
run the tack down stitches. Trim the front and back excess fabric, finish the design.
Remove from hoop and carefully trim away excess stabilizer.
(Make sure that you mirror 2 of the panels)
You will need 4 panels 2 with pockets 2 with out.

Flap

Hoop your stabilizer, I used 3oz cut away.
Run the placement stitches, lay down top fabric run the tack down stitches, next the placement stitches for the flower and butterfly lay down the fabric for the flower and butterfly and run the tack down stitches then trim the excess fabric from the flower and butterfly finish running them. Now lay down the back fabric and run the tack down stitches.
Trim the excess fabric from front and back then finish running the satin stitches.
You need 1.

Butterfly button:

hoop your stabilizer then run the placement stitches lay down the butterfly fabric and run the tack down stitches trim the fabric and run the dots and center of back. Lay down the back fabric and run the tack down stitches trim excess fabric then run the rest of the design, Trim away the excess stabilizer.

Handle

I cut a strip of fabric 2 ½ inches wide by 18 inches long. Fold right sides together and run a straight stitch to create a tube.
Turn the tube right side out and iron flat.

To assemble:

stitch your panels together at the center,.
You can do this by hand with a whip stitch or using a zig zag on a regular machine
Now add the back panels to the purse and stitch together.
Place the handle ends at each end of the purse top then lay the flap on top of them
stitch all together to hold the handle in and tack the flap to the back panels of the purse. Tack the ladybug like a button to the front pockets on the center seam, I then added a ribbon loop on the back of the flap using a glue gun to hold the ribbon in place.
