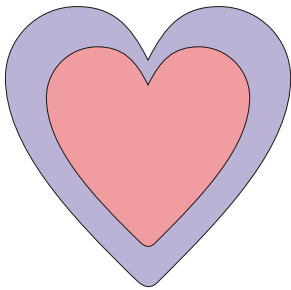


# Grandma's Play set Makeup.



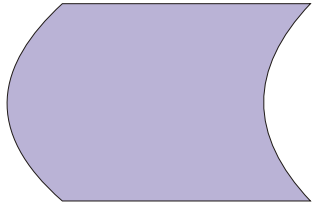
Compact.

Hoop your stabilizer. I used 2oz cut away. For the **mirror** portion run the placement stitches and lay down your fabric front and back. Next run the tack down stitches it will also run some cutting stitches.

Trim away the center fabric front and back but leave your stabilizer. Now run the satin stitches for the center. Now remove the hoop and trim the front and back fabric.

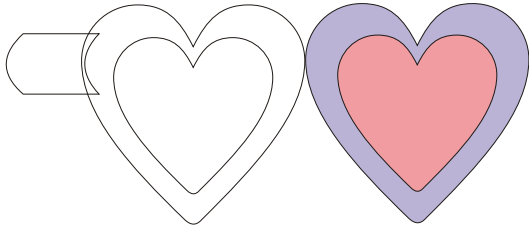
**Front** hoop your stabilizer I used 2oz cut away. Run your placement stitches then lay down your top fabric and run the tack down stitches and center design once the center design is done place your back fabric and run the tack down stitches trim the front and back and run the final satin stitches.

**Compact Bottom** hoop your stabilizer I used 2 oz cut away run your placement stitches then lay down your first fabric return to machine and stitch the tack down and then the second set of placement stitches lay down your center fabric. I used a sparkly fabric here to look like powder run your tack down stitches then trim. Run the center satin stitches now lay down a square of stabilizer and then your back fabric. The additional stabilizer will keep the bottom a bit stiffer. Run your tack down stitches then trim excess fabric and the second layer of stabilizer. Run the satin stitches to finish.



### Compact.

Hoop your stabilizer. I used 2oz cut away. For the **Tab** portion run the placement stitches and lay down your fabric front and back. Run the tack down stitches then trim. Finish by running the satin stitches.

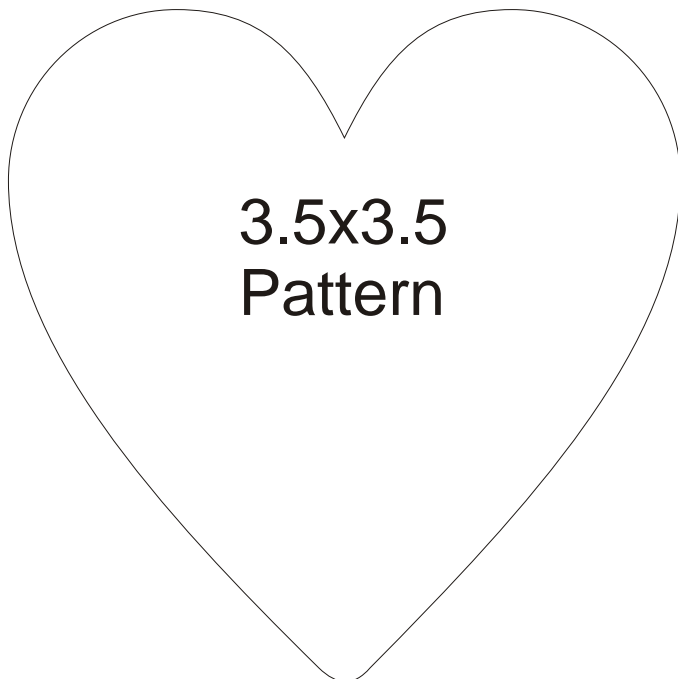


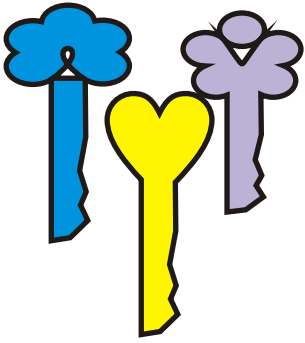
Cut a heart out of cardboard using the below pattern about 3.5x3.5 inches, make sure you can place the top and mirror portion over it and hand stitch together and not have the heart in the way. Using Mylar from a cookie package like Pop Tarts or using Aluminum foil wrap the heart to create a mirror the mylar will require glueing. Sandwich the mirror heart in between the top and Mirror part and I hand stitched using a whip stitch to hold together. You could hot glue this if you chose. Next I layed the bottom heart and the mirror section on top of each other and ran about an inch of stitches to hold together then on the back I also stitched the tab. On the front of the compact and on the tab I placed velcro to hold closed.

### Powder Puff

Hoop the stabilizer I used 2 oz cut away Run your placement stitches then lay down run the tack down stitches and the center design. Now remove hoop from machine and place a layer of bonded batting and then your fabric. Run the tack down stitches then trim front and back then run the finale satin stitches.

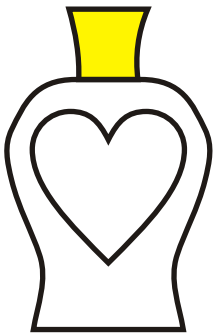
## Keys

Hoop your stabilizer I used 2oz cut away. Run your placement stitches then lay down your front and back fabric. Run the tack down stitches then trim the front and back. Then run the finish satin stitches.

Trim the center hole of the key with tiny scissors for added stiffness you can add a second small square of stabilizer to the back just under the back fabric.

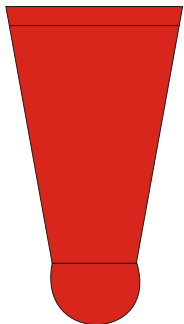
**Key Ring** Hoop the stabilizer and run the placement stitches lay down the top fabric. Run the tack down stitches and the center butterfly design. Then add your back fabric and run the tack down. Trim front and back fabric and then run the final satin stitches.

I used elastic and beads for my key holder and added the keys and key ring for more fun.



## Perfume.

Hoop your stabilizer I used 2 oz cut away run the placement stitches for the bottle lay down the front fabric. Run the tack down stitches then the center design. Lay down the back fabric and run tack down then lay down the fabric front and back for the bottle top. Run the tack down then trim all the fabric front and back Run the final satin stitches.
